EFOMP Travel Award for Young Physicists - 1999

Sponsored by EFOMP

The purpose of these awards is to promote the exchange of ideas between young physicists in the EFOMP Member countries.

The value of each reward will be determined, in part, by the proposed itinerary. For 1999 one travel award will be made; its value is likely to be in the region of 750-800 British pounds.

(An additional single award for a physicist to participate in the ESMP School in the year 2000 will be announced this spring.)

4. Details of present post and brief details of current duties

5. Details of proposed visits, with dates

Please attach letters of support from the Heads of Departments which are to be visited.

6. Please give a short account of the purpose of the proposed visits and of the expected benefits to the applicant.

7. Please supply an estimate of the cost of the proposed visits, including costs of travel, accommodation and food.

Applicants should seek information from the departments they plan to visit about the possibility of hospital, university or other inexpensive accommodation.

8. Declaration

I declare

- a) that I meet the conditions of eligibility for an EFOMP Travel Award;
- b) that I have made the suitable arrangements to be absent from my normal place of work for the duration of the proposed visits;
- c) that I will prepare a report on my visits, suitable for publication in *European Medical Physics News*.

Completed applications must be received by 15 March, 1999

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Applications are now invited for the above Travel Award

Conditions

1. Each applicant must submit an itinerary detailing the departments he or she wishes to visit.
2. The duration of the programme must be such as to include at least 10 working days (of which the first and last days may be counted) and should involve visits to departments in other countries that are members of EFOMP.
3. Applicants must be members of an EFOMP affiliated organisation, must be under 35 years on the date of application and must have been working as a medical physicist in either a hospital, university or research institute engaged in similar work for a period of at least two years.
4. Applications must be submitted to the Honorary Secretary of the respective National organisation for ratification. However, applicants are strongly advised to send a copy of their application to the Secretary General of EFOMP or to the EFOMP Registered Office, at the address below:
